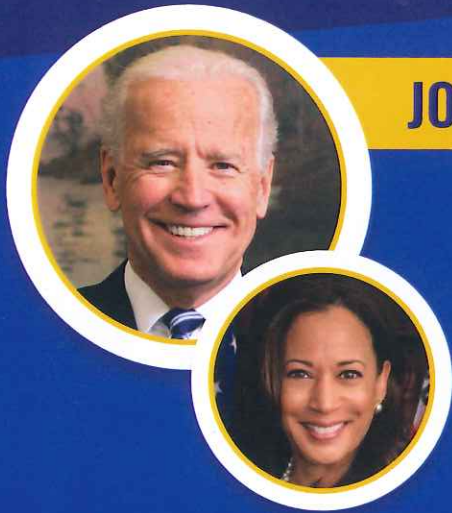


AMERICA IS

MICHIGAN SUPREME COURT

Chief Justice McCormack was first elected to the Michigan Supreme Court in 2012, and was elected by her colleagues in 2019 to serve as Chief Justice. As a professor at the University of Michigan Law school, McCormack launched numerous law clinics, including the Pediatric Health Advocacy, Domestic Violence Juvenile Justice; and Michigan Innocence Clinics. Justice McCormack voted in favor of our winning argument to return the three percent taken illegally from school employee paychecks from 2010 to 2012.

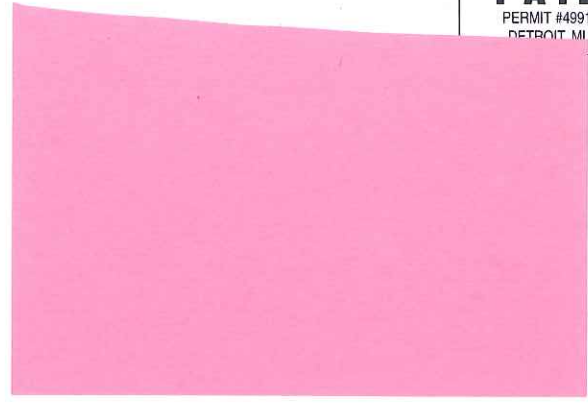

MICHIGAN STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION

Ellen Cogen Lipton: A fierce advocate for public education, Ellen Cogen Lipton served six years in the Michigan House of Representatives, including a term as Democratic Vice Chair of the House Education Committee.

MICHIGAN STATE UNIVERSITY TRUSTEES

Mark Bernstein: Holding a BA, JD, and MBA from the University of Michigan, Mark Bernstein was first elected to the Board of Regents in 2012 and has fought for affordable higher education, and advocating for graduate and lecturer faculty at the University of Michigan.

Shauna Ryder Diggs: As the first doctor elected to the University of Michigan Board of Regents in 2012, Shauna Ryder Diggs earned her BD and MD from the University of Michigan and is an advocate for lower tuition and financial responsibility, faculty advancement and support, and creating a strategic plan for diversity and inclusion. A former union member herself, Ryder Diggs has been a strong advocate for UM employees and their unions.

WAYNE STATE UNIVERSITY BOARD OF GOVERNORS

Eva Garza Dewaelsche: With BA and Masters of Education degrees from Wayne State University, Eva Garza Dewaelsche is running for WSU Governor to promote greater opportunities for students of color and non-traditional students, increase enrollment and graduation rates, and strengthen the voices of educators and workers in university decision making.

Shirley Stancato: Appointed to fill a vacancy on the Wayne State Board of Governors in 2019, Shirley Stancato is a social justice advocate and prominent Detroit civic and community leader. Stancato is an architect of civic engagement opportunities that bridge economic, geographical and racial divides and spent her career at the helm of New Detroit, uniting community organizations in the mission of identifying and eliminating racial disparities in metro Detroit.
